Subject: Approval for the Eurovignette agreement is urgently needed

Dear Members of the European Parliament,

We - please see the logos below - are a wide range of stakeholders keenly urging Members of the

European Parliament to support the reform of the Eurovignette Directive in the upcoming votes.

In June 2021 negotiators on behalf of the European Parliament and Council reached an agreement on

revising this directive in trilogue negotiations. Last November this agreement was formally adopted by

Council. On January 13th, the European Parliament's TRAN committee will formally vote on the agreement

before a plenary vote expected in mid-February.

The EU, its Member States, vehicle manufacturers and transport operators are all increasing their climate

commitments in line with Fit for 55. With this comes the need to give planning and investment certainty

for the most energy efficient technology. One of the best ways to achieve this is by varying truck tolls

according to climate emissions. This has been discussed across the EU since the European Commission

presented its proposal to revise the Eurovignette Directive in June 2017. Varying truck tolls for CO2 is now

at the heart of the reform agreed in trilogue, as it should be. And, if reflected in law, this revision will

provide the long-promised and urgently needed reform to enable the transition to zero emission freight

vehicles.

There is broad support across civil society and the corporate sector for the agreed deal, as shown by

stakeholder reaction to both the trilogue agreement in June, and the informal vote of the TRAN committee

in July.

The transport transition to reducing climate impact and zero emission vehicles cannot advance in a timely

way without the legislative reform needed to deliver it. After more than four and half years of

negotiations, now is the time to close this deal, and we urge you to support it.
